**Most Veterans are Eligible for VA Health Care**  
**Why Enroll, How to Enroll, File a Claim**

Enrollment is easy and free, and health care may be free as well.

VA funding is based on enrollment numbers. Help others by enrolling.

Veteran trust in VA health care is above 90%.

Also, file a health-related compensation claim, and access other benefits.

**Apply for VA health care by calling the Health Eligibility Center (HEC)**  
**(877) 222-8387**, Monday – Friday, 8:00am – 8:00pm Eastern Time.

If more than a week passes after applying, with no response, call again.

**Contact your County VA Office and Veteran Service Officers (VSO).**

They provide accredited claims services (Health care AND other benefits) for Veterans and their families at no charge. [LINK](#)

**Call 800-MICH-VET (800-642-4838)** (the Michigan Veteran Resource Service Center).

Veterans and their survivors could be eligible for previously denied compensation.

Your current VA disability rating could increase. This could provide a significant increase in monthly compensation, especially for Veterans with dependents.

Even those already receiving the maximum monthly benefit due to a 100% disability rating should contact their VSO. This could benefit their family later.

The PACT Act is a new law, and the most significant expansion and extension of Veteran benefits, eligibility, and care in more than 30 years.
