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Health Information Exchange P4P Initiatives

Peer group 1-4

- P4P HIE incentives introduced in 2014
- In 2017, focus is on transmitting data for new use cases and meeting data conformance standards
- High participation rate (83 of 83 P4P hospitals)

Peer group 5

- HIE Admission Discharge Transfer measure introduced in the 2016-2017 P4P
- Currently, initiative remains an “optional” measure
- Participation rates remain low (19 of 44 hospitals)
- Considering making the HIE ADT measure a requirement in 2018-2019 P4P

PGIP

- Initiative program began in 2014
- In 2017, focus is on receiving data and incorporating it into practice workflows
- High ADT participation rate; primarily PCPs (37 of 47 POs)



Why is the HIE Initiative a P4P Requirement?

Provides all-payer, all-patient information from a single access point

Enables consistent communication regardless of provider affiliation

Provides more timely notification of ADT and ER events

Provides foundational support for the PCMH team-based approach to care

Results in better care coordination and reduced readmissions



HIE P4P Highlights

Main Goal:

- Implement the ADT use case to transmit all patient, all payer, validated admission, discharge and transfer data, on a daily basis, into the statewide notification service for distribution to practitioners who have a care relationship with each patient.

P4P Successful Participation =

- Having hospital IT staff contact MiHIN
- Meeting the following criteria:
 1. Agree to all respective data use case agreements associated with the notification service
 2. Agree to meet timelines associated with the project
 3. Transmit the MiHIN required minimum ADT data elements on a daily basis
 4. Work toward data conformance for required ADT elements in order to provide recipients with quality data
