

### **FUNDING EXCLUSIONS**

- Organizations that discriminate because of age, race, ethnic origin, religion, sexual orientation, disability, or gender
- Requests to increase COVID-19
  testing or vaccination capacity
- Requests that are exclusively for the purchase of personal protective equipment, medications, or medical devices
- Lobbying activities
- Tuition costs and related fees

- Existing and ongoing program operations and staffing, including staffing models that do not leverage available insurance reimbursement avenues
- Clinical or academic research
- Capital projects
- Electronic medical record software
- Loans
- Litigation
- Health-related emergencies\*

\* The Health Fund might in some situations consider support to address longer-term rebuilding or other needs following emergency situations.
