## MATERNAL & INFANT HEALTH

## PROGRAM PRIORITIES

- Improving the quality of life for older adults with Alzheimer's and other dementias
- Supporting a strong direct care workforce in Michigan
- Preventing elder abuse and neglect
- Increasing respite opportunities for caregivers
- Addressing social determinants of health for older adults
- **Rural Health and Aging – supporting projects that improve the health of older adults and caregivers living in rural areas**





# FUNDING EXCLUSIONS

- Organizations that discriminate because of age, race, ethnic origin, religion, sexual orientation, disability, or gender
- Requests to increase COVID-19 testing or vaccination capacity
- Requests that are exclusively for the purchase of personal protective equipment, medications, or medical devices
- Lobbying activities
- Tuition costs and related fees
- Existing and ongoing program operations and staffing, including staffing models that do not leverage available insurance reimbursement avenues
- Clinical or academic research
- Capital projects
- Electronic medical record software
- Loans
- Litigation
- Health-related emergencies\*
  - \* The Health Fund might in some situations consider support to address longer-term rebuilding or other needs following emergency situations.
