(Law is 491.12) Patient Triage: Application: Ensure emerging diseases are defined in risk assessment. Risk assessment should be dated within the last 2 years. Gathering of Supplies: Include in planning: availability of PPE, critical care equipment, transportation needs Application: Create a policy within the emergency plan to address how the clinic will monitor and maintain PPE, critical care equipment, and transportation needs. Pinpoint who is responsible for updating this. Monitoring: The clinic may include a policy delegating an individual to monitor guidance by public health agencies and issuing directives and recommendations to staff.
