

# **BREAKING: FORHP's Budget Requests Announced for FY'24**

The U.S. Department of Health & Human Service's budget request for FY 2024, Building a Healthy America, was released on March 9, 2023, and HRSA's FY 2024 Congressional Budget Justification was released on March 13, 2023.

The total request for the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) was a budget of \$416 million, an *increase of \$63 million* from the FY 2023 enacted budget. This budget request would enable FORHP to continue funding technical assistance partners, expanding reach to additional rural communities, and developing three new programs.

Notable increases would include:
-Rural Outreach Grants: \$2 million

-Rural Communities Opioids Response Program: \$20 million

-Rural Health Clinic Behavioral Health Initiative: \$10 million

-Rural Hospital Sustainability (including RHCs and CAHs): \$30 million

-Financial and Community Sustainability for At-Risk Rural Hospitals Program: \$10 million

-Rural Hospital Stabilization Pilot Program: \$20 million

The request also proposes significant investments in the health workforce. HRSA's **Bureau of Health Workforce** would see an overall increase of \$892 million from the FY 2023 budget, of which **National Health Service Corps** would receive a \$548 million increase to ensure even more providers are incentivized to practice in underserved and rural communities.

Additionally, \$125 million would be added to the **Ending the HIV Epidemic in the United States Initiative**, specifically to increase evidence-based practices and support HIV care for clients including those in the seven states with substantial rural HIV burdens.

### Apply Today for the National Health Service Corps Loan Repayment Program

The National Health Service Corps (NHSC) is now accepting applications for three loan repayment programs.

Each program has a different award level and varying eligibility:

- NHSC Loan Repayment
   Program provides up to \$50,000 for a two-year service commitment.
- NHSC Substance Use Disorder
   Workforce Loan Repayment
   Program provides up to \$75,000 for a
   three-year service commitment.
- NHSC Rural Community Loan
   Repayment Program provides up to \$100,000 for a three-year service commitment.

In addition to tax-free loan repayment, you receive a competitive salary, and a chance to

have a significant impact on an underserved community.

The application deadline for ALL programs is Thursday, April 27, 2023 at 7:30 p.m. ET.

# NEW: SAMHSA Rural Emergency Medical Services Training Notice of Funding Opportunity



The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) expects to make 37 awards with total funding of \$7.4 million to train emergency medical services (EMS) personnel in rural areas.

**Grant program description:** The purpose of this program is to recruit and train EMS personnel in rural areas with a particular focus on addressing substance use disorders (SUD) and co-occurring disorders (COD) substance use and mental disorders. Recipients will be expected to train EMS personnel on SUD and COD, trauma-informed, recovery-based care for people with such disorders in emergency situations and, as appropriate, to maintain licenses and certifications relevant to serve in an EMS agency.

Applications are due: Monday, May 1st, 2023

The Biden Administration announced the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) Declaration is anticipated to end on May 11, 2023. This will significantly impact CMS Certified Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs).

Please disseminate this to your state's RHCs and FQHCs to help them stay up-to-date and in compliance.
