

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) issued a bulletin Jan. 5 to expand the types of providers who can perform Medicaidcovered, nonphysician outpatient behavioral health services.

Effective Feb. 4, Medicaid will cover and reimburse outpatient behavioral health services provided by graduates of board-approved master's or doctoral-level psychology, social work, counseling or marriage and

NEW Grant Funding Opportunity: FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant Application Now Open

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) application is now open! The objectives of the AFG program are to provide critically needed resources that equip and train family therapy educational training programs, so long as they have completed the requirements for a limited or temporary license; regardless of whether the license has been issued.

These staff must be supervised by a Medicaidenrolled, fully licensed provider of the same profession.

Services should be billed to Medicaid under this supervising provider, not the graduate. This time-limited allowance for new graduates is applicable from the date the individual completed their graduate course work for a period not to exceed one year and does not replace the graduate's obligation of obtaining the appropriate limited or temporary license from the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs. It is strictly a

The application deadline is February 10th, 2023.

Now Accepting Applications for the Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program

Would you like help to pay off your loans? The<u>Nurse</u> <u>Corps Loan Repayment Program</u> provides loan repayment to nurses in exchange for a minimum twoyear full-time service commitment, at an eligible health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses or an eligible school of nursing.

Are You Eligible?

- You must be a:
 - Licensed registered nurse;

New Law Expands VA Program for Veterans to Buy Vehicles Adapted for Their Disabilities



Under a new law this month, veterans who need modified vehicles to get around will be eligible for an automobile grant from the VA every 10 years. Previously, the VA would only allow one purchase across a veterans' lifetime.

Retired Army Chief Warrant

- Advanced practice registered nurse, such as a nurse practitioner; or
- Nurse faculty member
- You received your nursing education from an accredited school of nursing located in a U.S. state or territory.
- You work full-time in either:
 - An <u>eligible critical shortage facility</u> in a high need area or
 - An eligible school of nursing

Key Features:

- Gain access to My Professionals' Tracking System, the centralized dashboard that tracks all your interactions with your health professionals.
- My Professionals' Tracking System allows you to streamline all of your potential candidates both from 3RNET and from external sources in one place.
- Keep your jobs updated in one spot with the embeddable job feed. Jobs are automatically updated on your website as well as on 3RNET.org.
- Streamline the application process with embeddable job applicant forms. Candidate submissions are automatically populated within your My Professionals' Tracking System dashboard.
- Set up reminders to follow up with your job candidates.
- No HTML coding or other tech abilities are necessary.

Officer Neal Williams has owned several vehicles in the last 25 years that were modified to accommodate his wheelchair and let him drive with hand controls. For his first vehicle, Williams, who is paralyzed as the result of a combat injury in Vietnam, used a one-time grant from the VA and drove it more than 250,000 miles, until it fell

"I've worn out several vehicles. This legislation allows veterans with mobility issues to be able to aet their medical care and go about their normal daily routines that they otherwise wouldn't be able to on their own," Williams said in an interview with Military.com from his home in rural Maine.
